

A CASE OF MYOPIA

HISTORY:

Age 33, Male, came in for examination September 12, 1935. RX worn -1.25-.50x90 OU. Visual acuity in each eye 20/20-1.

PRESENTING SYMPTOM:

Tired eyes with projection to lower lids, $\alpha\omega$ pupil.

BIO-TYPE:

Pyknic, leaning toward syntonics.

Examination revealed practically the same Rx for greater distant vision and trying showed a practically negative case.

TREATMENT:

Syntonics treatments were prescribed in order to reduce the myopia and to eliminate the $\alpha\omega$ pupil.

One N/L $\alpha\omega$ – Reported headaches and discomfort following day.

Three L $\theta\omega$

Five N/L $\alpha\omega$ – Reported no discomfort.

Two L $\mu\pi$

Sept. 27, 1936 – Examination revealed OD - -.50-.75x90; OS - -.50-.75x75 with a visual acuity of 20/15 OU.

Ten days later patient reported perfect comfort.

Six weeks later the Visual Acuity had improved.
