Jan 30th. Vision real good. Esotropia all gone. Body posture and head normal and was in Kindergarten.

1968. Had some V.T. Base in Rotation 10 times.

May, 1969. School Report Card always good and reading twice the amount of older brothers and is an active Cub Scout now.

Mother said that before he came in, the child didn't play with toys due to the fact he had to hold object 2 inches from his eyes and could not tell what they were. Same while eating. Stumbled indoors and outdoors
