

A CASE REPORT  
(Myopia)

The following case may be of interest to some of our members.

Patient, D.V, a girl of eight, 2<sup>nd</sup> grade in school. Myopic. Parents are willing to cooperate. No glasses have been worn. Naked V. A., 20/100 O.U. Either eye, a little less. Prescribed near point or reading glasses. Plus 87. (I believe this should be the first step if patient can read at the proper distance). No distant lenses were prescribed, although -3.000 was required on either eye to give 20/30 vision.

This is the Syntonic Rx:

N/L 3", A. delta 7", M. delta 5", Delta theta 8", M. theta S7". All frequencies, fast flash.

Patient was given two series of syntonic sessions (a total of 30). Naked vision came up to 76.5%, or 20/50 a 27.6 improvement. This fall, after she has been in school 6 or 7 weeks we will note what the impact of school work has been to her nervous system. Syntonics will be continued.

I hesitate to mention fees, but sometimes we like to know what the other fellow is doing in all departments. Most every day patients tell us of the high hospital charges. By comparison we are just little pikers. Several hundred dollars for only a brief period.

In this case the parents were happy to pay me what they considered a reasonable fee. I charged \$20.00 for the analysis. \$22.00 for the glasses and \$150. For syntonic procedure or vision training. They paid \$75.00 at the start of each series or 15 sessions. Our work can only be appreciated if we charge a respectable fee. I do hope that I have said something which will help someone.

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
