## **HEADACHE C-1 TYPE**

HISTORY: Case No. 3721; Student: Age 17

Patient came to me on September 11, 1936.

Complaint: Patient had broken lenses about three months

previous to the time she came to me, but she complained of the fact that the glasses bothered her for about a year in that her eyes felt uncomfortable without them. The subjective symptom, headache, was experienced

practically every day especially since she had been without Rx

DESCRIPTION: Asthenic; short; medium fleshy.

EXAMINATION; Three months previously patient had been wearing

FINDINGS: OD -.50x5, OS -.50x180. The objective findings was

found to be C-1type, with number 19 OD 4.00, OS 4.00,

number 20 +.75, number 21 +1.00.

Visual condition: Acuity NV OD 20/40-, OS 20/30.

SYNTONIZATIONS: The syntonizations μδ with -1.00 added were given

consecutively, followed by 6  $\alpha\omega$  syntonizations with base in

technique also used in conjunction with latter filter, making a total of eight in all. Treatments were given

daily with five days rest between last two.

Results: First syntonization made patient dizzy and gave her a headache which

lasted for a short time only. New Rx was given after the second treatment and on the day of the third treatment she also had a slight headache, but after that her headaches disappeared entirely.

After the eighth treatment the number 19, 20 and 21

findings were found to be improved.

Prescription: On Sept. 10, 1936 the following Rx was given OD -.75x5, OS -.62x180. This Rx afforded the acuity of OD 20/20+, OS 20/20, OU 20/20+4. Patient was dismissed on Sept 23, 1936 with the satisfaction of more comfortable vision and the happiness that she no

longer endured headaches.
