INFLAMATION

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HISTORY:

Case No. 4748; Housewife; Age 65. Patient came to me on July 7, 1936

the

COMPLAINT: Patient was struck forur years age at the articulation of frontal and right malor bones about the level with the eye. Lid was puffed and red. This swellen condition was permanent over the period of four years. She also complained of eye ball paining and of lid being stiff and heavy. She complained of a heavy feeling on the whole right side of face.

DESCRIPTION:

Asthenic; medium height; medium fleshy.

EXAMINATION

FINDINGS:

She was wearing the perscription OU +1.50 for distance

and OU +4.00 for reading.

VISUAL CONDITION: Acuity with old Rx. 01 20/25 OS 20/25-

SYNTONIZATIONS: One L 0 syntonization was given each day for four days.

RESULTS:

Noticed relief after first syntonization, eye first felt lighter, and it did not pain so much. After each syntonization she noticed improvement. At the end of the fourth syntonization redness and puffyness were gone and eyeball and lids were natural in appearance. Right side of face appeared like left side.

PRESCRIPTION: On July 13, 1936, the following Rx was given for distance OD +1.75 -.50 x 170, OS +1.25. This afforded an acuity of OD 20/20- OS 20/20. Patient was dismissed with the happiness that the right eye felt normal again.
