## PAIN IN ENTIRE RIGHT HEMISPHERE

HISTORY:	Case No. 4630, Housewife; age 54. Patient came to see me on May 12, 1936
	Complains: Ache on whole right side of head, especially the occipital half. Patient described the pain were as a fullness in the head. There was some throbbing. This pain had kept her awake at night for the last few weeks. Before coming to me she had several examinations by practitioners of medicine without obtaining any relief. Her neck was stiff. She was nervous. Her right ear hurt. Patient also stated that she had had some pain for years on the right side of the head.
DESCRIPTION:	Asthenic: medium height; medium fleshy; quite active.
EXAMINATION: FINDINGS	She was wearing the prescription OD +.2525 x 180 OS +.50 x 180 with an add of OU +2.00. Visual conditions: NV OD 20/25 OS 20/50, acuity with old prescription OU 20/25. Complete examination was not made at the first visit.
SYNTONIZATIONS:	Seven N/L $\omega\pi$ (OMEGA PI) daily, then followed three syntonizations N/L $\alpha\omega$ . Total ten syntonizations.
RESULTS:	After the third syntonization pain and stiffness of neck was materially relieved. Patient was able to sleep most of the night. At the end of the ninth syntonization all symptoms were entirely relieved.
	Prescription: OD +.5050 x 90 and OS +1.75-1.2 5x 90 with 1.50 base in divided between the two lenses with an add of +2.00 was given. Report on June 13, 1936, indicated all headaches and all stiffness gone and the patient having more pep, more happiness, and a more cheerful outlook on life.
