This is an unusual case report and what was done may appear to be out of our field. However, the Medics failed completely. The patient was seeking help and not interested in professional ethics. In reality it is a rare and isolated case which will come to our attention only occasionally. I have been asked to present it in the FORUM for the personal benefit of our members, and not a basis for general Syntonic practice. The information may prove to be of value at some future time. Whether you ever attempt a similar case will depend upon existing circumstances which always alter cases. My one wish is that I can paint a word picture which will tell the story in detail, and bring credit to Syntonic procedure.

I have been given the bare details by the doctor (Mayer) and I must assume the responsibility for any degree relative to the successful handling of the case. Not only was the response of the technique encouraging and pleasing to the patient, but his understanding to an adequate fee was also most encouraging.

Our president is quite concerned about fees. He regrets that, as a rule, we fail to give this item ample consideration. This results in the down grading of the value of our service. In most cases we charge less than the patient expects to pay.

On July 7, 1961, Mr. (H) aged 59 reported at his office. The history revealed that six years ago a growth "from nose to cornea" came on his left eye. He was advised that the growth was a Pterygium and could be removed by surgery. This was done and appeared to be successful. Then it "hazed" over and an open sore appeared in the center. This was diagnosed as an ulcer and remained unchanged for a period of four years. Think of it, a period of "four years". He consulted three very good medics, and some not so good, without beneficial results. Recently the right eye has been inflamed most of the time,

In some way, Mr. (H) learned of a non-medical procedure, and that is when our friend Don came into the picture. After an elaborate history and vision analysis reveals that he now has a Pterygium on the right eye. The left is covered by gray scar tissue and a central ulcer. To avoid any misunderstanding, or a false interpretation of our work, the patient was instructed that we do not treat anything. We use the Syntonic procedure which comes under the heading of vision training. A most gentle form of exercise. After eleven (11) Syntonic sessions the ulcer has healed over (smooth and complete) and Pterygium is being reduced in the right eye. Case will be continued. The Syntonic Rx is slightly different, or rather the nascentizing. It is local with U 5 (Upsilon), MU 12 (Mu Upsilon), UD6 Upsilon D), UWD 10 (Upsilon Omega), Alter with Local U5 (Upsilon), M Pi 12 (Mu Pi), W6 (Upsilon), UWN 10 (Upsilon Omega N).
